RULES AND REGULATIONS

TEAM MANAGERS

- Each school requires a nominated team manager.
- All Team Managers must be approved by their school Principal. All Team Managers must have a Working With Children Check (WWCC) clearance. All nominations must be approved by the Team Manager appointed by that school.
- Can be a shared role/have multiple if a large team.
- Team managers must assess the suitability of the horse and rider combination.
- Carry out gear check for each of their riders prior to competing in each event throughout the day.
- Team Managers should ensure that their riders' equipment is such that it will pass Equestrian Australia regulations or the student will not be permitted to compete. Team Managers are totally responsible for checking the suitability and safety of their rider's gear ie. approved safety helmet, irons (10mm each side of boot), sound stitching of reins, stirrup leathers and girths.
- It is the Team Manager's responsibility to ensure that all students are nominated in their correct grades for Showjumping and Combined Training.
- Team Managers can collect their folders, timetable and other information from the Lunch shed from 12noon on Friday 21st July. A Team Managers meeting will be held at the Lunch shed at 4.00pm on Friday 21st July.

COMPETITION DISCLAIMER

Neither the organisers, nor the owners of the grounds, nor Equestrian Australia accepts any liability for any accidents, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators or any other person whatsoever.

CHANGES TO PROGRAM

The organisers reserve the right to cancel or change any class or event, divide or combine any classes, transfer competitors between sections of a class, to alter the advertised times and to refuse any entry with or without stating the reason.

CANCELLATION OF EVENT

Should the event have to be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances all monies will be returned less the admin fee

WEATHER

Should inclement weather force the cancellation, the event may be rescheduled.

PERSONAL ACCIDENT COVER

Orange Anglican Grammar School does not offer any individual insurance cover for injury to competitors at the Event. It is the responsibility of competitors to provide their own personal injury insurance if so desired; this includes Private Health Insurance, Medical and Ambulance cover. Check with your school if they have Ambulance cover as most do.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Strictly no dogs - entry will be refused if a dog is present or you'll be asked to leave
- No scooters off any sort
- No bikes
- No drones
- Parents must nominate to do a task/job for entry to proceed
- Event is run under Equestrian Australia rules.
- Riders to be financial members of Equestrian Australia. Horses need not be registered.
- All competitors, parents/helpers and volunteers must follow COVID-19 guidelines where possible.
- Maps will be supplied to indicate parking, camping, horse free zones, warm up, lungeing, competitions. Please adhere to the designated areas.

DRESS

Approved Equestrian Australia safety helmet as per Article 122 (Equestrian Australian General Regulations). All helmets must be tagged. Any riders found not wearing an approved safety helmet will be asked to dismount. Heeled smooth soled riding boots, cream jodphurs, school shirt, jumper and tie in school colours. NO blazers or riding coats permitted. Proof of insurance will be required.

YARDS

\$50 yard bond fee – will not be refunded if yards are left dirty. Any temporary yard erected must be constructed of meta and indicated at the time of entry. No rope or tape yards may be used at any time. Permission must be sought from the organising committee in writing at entry.

DRAW

- Time slots and spots for Combined training, dressage and showjumping will be allocated through a draw. Riders must be on time. Spots will not be held.
- The draw /s and other information pertaining to this event will be posted on the Orange Anglican Grammar School Interschools Facebook page. Draws will be emailed via Nominate.
- A rider wishing to change section or times in any draw, must advise the organisers in writing as soon as possible and before the day starts.

GEAR CHECK

- It is the team managers responsibility to ensure equipment is safe and meets the EA Standards.
- Gear check must be carried out by each schools team manager.

CAMPING

- Camp only in designated area. These are horse free zones. Riders must carry gear to yards.
- Fire pits allowed.
- All power cords and extension sets must have a current in-date test tag displayed with the details of the testing officer displayed on the tag. Power leads must not be laid on vehicle or horse access routes unless they are suitably protected, i.e. covered with rubber matting. Anyone found not adhering to these rules will not be allowed to plug into the main power. Power is limited. One ppt outlet per site allocated only.
- No horses are to be in the camping area at any time.

HORSE AND RIDER

- Riders must be familiar with EA rules
- Use bridal and saddle pad numbers. Can use your existing EA number or a number will be allocated to non EA registered horses.
- A medical armband must be worn when riding.
- Riders can bring multiple horses, but can only ride the nominated horse for the chosen event. However the organising committee cannot hold events where clashes occur.
- All riders will be provided with a map indicating where horses can be ridden, cannot be ridden, where they can only be warmed up and lunged.
- Only the nominated rider may ride/school the horse but a horse maybe lunged by someone other than the rider. Helmet must be worn when lunging. Failure to abide by this rule will mean disqualification of the horse from the rest of the event. Horses must only be lunged at the designated area.
- Horse may only be warmed up at the designated area.
- All horses must be ridden at a walk when not in a designated practice or competition area
- Any rider falling from a horse on the day of competition will be checked by medical staff and may not be permitted to ride again that day.
- Orange Anglican Grammar School reserves the right to ask horse and rider considered unsuitable/unsafe to dismount.
- Show jumping grading, Proof of grading or recommendation of height required. Rider can only jump in nominated height.
- In the event of illness or injury (or for any other reason the Committee may allow) a suitable horse may be substituted. Orange Anglican Grammar School must be contacted no later than Thursday 20th July by email equestrian@oags.nsw.edu.au
- No riding of horses after dark unless competing in an event. No riding of horses without a bridle and saddle. No riding of horses that are wearing rugs.
- No horse is to be jumping the cross country jumps at the grounds at any time.

REFUNDS

- Prior to the closing date a \$50.00 administration fee will be charged and the balance of the nomination fee and stabling/yard fee refunded;
- After the closing date a \$50.00 administration fee will be charged and the balance of the nomination fee refunded on receipt of a medical or veterinary certificate
- After the closing date the nomination fee will be forfeited if no medical or veterinary certificate is received.
- Notification of scratchings must be made by email to equestrian@oags.nsw.edu.au and a refund will be made via the credit card used for payment. If vet or medical certificate is required this should be scanned and sent to Orange Anglican Grammar School email equestrian@oags.nsw.edu.au
- There will be no refunds on yards or stables after date 15/7/2023.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- By entering this event you give your consent to Orange Anglican Grammar School to copy or reproduce images of yourself without acknowledgement of yourself and without your entitlement to any remuneration or compensation now or in the future. The images may be used by Orange Anglican Grammar School in multimedia productions, publications, brochures and on the website to promote a range of initiatives.
- Welfare of the horse is paramount.
- Unsportsmanlike behaviour will not be tolerated.
- Any rider who does not abide by ENSW and/or his/her School's Code of Conduct maybe reported to the organising Committee and may be disqualified from further competition.
- Riders, their parents and spectators are expected to treat all officials and fellow competitors with respect and assist where possible in the smooth running of the competition. In the case of failure to show respect, the rider, their parents and spectators will be required to leave the grounds for the remainder of the competition by order of the organising committee.

DISPUTES

- All Judges' decisions must be respected, but queries may be made in writing to the organising Committee. Queries will be considered and the decision is final.

PARKING

- Park vehicles only in designated area. Parking is at own risk.

SPORTING RULES

BENDING RACE

1. There will be five pegs.
2. The distance between the start line and the first peg will be 8 metres and between pegs 6 metres.
3. Spacing between lines of pegs will be 12 metres and there is no limit to the number of lines of pegs used.
4. Pegs shall be between 1.35 and 1.5 metres high.
5. Competitors must leave the first peg on their right.
6. Each competitor must keep to his/her own line of pegs. Crossing over a demarcation line, placed 6 metres out from each line of pegs, will incur disqualification. A steward is required on each "demarcation line" to indicate disqualifications or infringements.
7. The competitor is deemed to have crossed the demarcation line if one or more of the horse's feet is placed on or over this line.
8. Knocking down of any pegs will mean disqualification.
9. No horse may be held or accompanied to the starting line or outside assistance given. Penalty for breach of this rule is disqualification.
10. The start is to be left to the judge's discretion, but he need not wait any longer than 30 seconds for any horse.
11. A moving start may be allowed at the judge's discretion.
12. It is the option of the organizers to conduct the event as follows:
 - a) In heats, semi-finals and finals, or
 - b) Against the clock, or c) By taking the required number of fastest times to fill the placings, to be run off as the final, in a first past the post contest.
13. Pegs should not be touched by the contestants' hands and if in the opinion of the judge a peg is deliberately prevented from falling by the use of the hand, such action can mean disqualification.
14. If the event is run off in heats: only horses placed first in heats may run off in semi-finals and/or finals. If there are insufficient first place getters in heats, to fill all final placings, then horses placed second in heats run off against each other for any unfilled minor placings.
15. In heats or semi-finals, disqualified horses will take no further part in the event and should retire from the course.
16. Schooling on the course is not permitted.
17. No peg or standard may be driven into the ground.
18. If at the judge's discretion, a false start is declared, riders will be recalled by whistle or bell.
19. A peg or pegs broken in a bending race will be deemed a knocked down peg.
20. The winner and place getters are declared when the riders have passed the finishing line, mounted on their horses and with all pegs in his/her line standing and the course has been completed in accordance with these rules.
21. In the event of all competitors in the final being disqualified for infringement of rules, the final must be re-run to determine a winner.
22. If some of the finalists are eliminated in the final heat, leaving insufficient competitors to fill all the placings, the remaining minor placings will be determined by their times taken in the qualifying round and only if competitors remain equal, a re-run of horses concerned is conducted.

BARREL RACE

1. Barrel distances are as shown on the sketch. The outside edge of the barrel will touch the measured spot in order that the horse will be required to travel only the measured distance.
2. Barrels are to be 44 gallon size drums, with tyres.
3. Riders may go to either right or left barrel first, but must make one left hand turn and two right turns, or one right turn and two left turns.
4. The starting and finishing line and the position of the barrels must be marked permanently for the entire fixture.
5. A 5 second penalty will be added for:
 - a. each barrel knocked over;
 - b. each barrel touched with hand.
6. A flying start is allowed.
7. Riders are in the hands of the judges once they say they are ready, but judges will not start riders until they advise they are ready.
8. Watches used to be in at least tenths of a second.
9. Horses are to be timed on the nose crossing the starting and finishing line.
10. In any championship there are to be at least 2 official timers — an official timer and a check timer. These timers are to remain the same throughout the championship, except in the case of sickness or injury.
11. Each horse may have only one start in the event.
12. In determining the first 5 placings, if any horses register equal times, the horses concerned will be re-run to determine their placings.
13. Horses registering equal times for placings for 6th to 10th place will be scored by equalizing the points.

Disqualification to result from: **a.** Not following the prescribed barrel racing patterns. **b.** Any horse which in the opinion of the judge is deemed to be unfit for the event, to be disqualified at the discretion of the judge or judges. **c.** Excessive hitting of the horse with spurs, whips or any object whatsoever. **d.** The carrying of whip in the mouth

RIDER IN ACTION

This will include a range of challenges including cross country obstacles, a bridge, and a water jump. Riders must wear current cross country vests. This event will be judged on time and number of efforts eg three refusals equals disqualification.

KEY HOLE RACE

A lane 12m long and 1.2m wide is marked with whiting, make a circle 6m in diameter on one end of the lane. The starting line is at the end of the lane opposite the circle. Another line is made 6m before reaching the starting line. This is a timed event and time starts at the starting line entering the lane. The rider must have his horse inside the back line and the horse must stop his forward motion before starting the race. He then has 6m to start the horse before time begins, at the entry of the lane. Competitor rides down the lane turning inside the circle and returning down the lane. Time starts and stops upon entering and leaving the lane. Rider will be disqualified if a horse steps on or over the line. If a horse steps back across the first line, an additional stop of his forward motion shall be required in the 6m zone. After the original crossing of the first line, 30 seconds will be allowed to enter the lane. Three judges will be used. Note: The 6m line is to create a 6m zone and does not have to be drawn all of the way across the arena. The rider may enter the zone at any place.

FLAG RACING

1. There will be a "cask" or some similar approved container and five pegs to each line with a detachable flag on each peg. The cask must face the pegs.
2. Distance between pegs to be 6 metres and from "cask" to first peg to be 8 metres.
3. Spacing between lines of pegs to be 12 metres and there is no limit to the lines of pegs used.
4. There shall be a starting and finishing line 6 metres from the "cask", for manual or electronic timing, the crossing of which, prior to the finish of the race, will earn disqualification.
5. A "line of demarcation" will be drawn or shown 6 metres on each side of each line of pegs, and competitors must keep within these lines. Crossing these lines will mean disqualification. Disqualified horses must withdraw immediately. Should a competitor, while crossing a demarcation line, interfere in any degree with another line of pegs, competitor or horse, the heat, semi-final or final in which this infringement occurs will be stopped as speedily as possible and re-run, but the competitor causing the infringement will be automatically disqualified.
6. The "cask" to be a peg with a bag attached at the top to collect flags. Pegs shall be between 135cm and 150cm high. The flag bag and cask that is not fixed and swivels on its base or pole may be placed in a position to face the starting position.
7. Each competitor must leave the pegs on his/her right and take the furthest peg first, then the second furthest peg and continue in that sequence.
8. If the "cask" is knocked down by the competitor, he/she is to re-erect it before continuing.
9. Should the competitor fail to lodge any flag in the cask, he must dismount, pick up the flag, mount, and place the flag in the "cask" before continuing.
10. In the event of any flag being dropped or knocked down, the competitor must immediately dismount, pick up the flag, and continue in the correct sequence.
11. A competitor is considered to have crossed the "demarcation line" if one or more of the horse's feet are placed on or over the line.
12. A steward is required on each "demarcation line" to indicate disqualifications or infringements.
13. No horse may be held or accompanied to the starting line or outside assistance given. Penalty for breach of this rule is disqualification.
14. The start is to be left to the judge's discretion, but he need not wait any longer than 30 seconds for any horse.
15. There shall be a standing start, but a moving start may be allowed at the judge's discretion.
16. It is the option of the organizers to conduct the events as follows:
 - a) In heats, semi-finals and finals, or,
 - b) Against the clock, or
 - c) By taking the required number of fastest times to fill the placings, to be run off as the final, in a first past the post contest.
17. If the event is run off in heats: only horses placed first in heats may run off in semi-finals and/or finals. If there are insufficient first place getters in heats to fill all final placings, then horses placed second in heats run off against each other for any unfilled minor placings.
18. In heats or semi-finals, disqualified horses will take no further part in the event and should retire from the course without causing interference to other competitors.
19. Hitting the horse with the flag incurs disqualification.
20. Schooling on the course is not permitted.
21. No receptacle or standard may be driven into the ground.
22. Any recall for infringement or false start shall be by whistle or bell.
23. A broken peg is classified as a knock down.
24. The winner and place getters are declared when the riders have passed the finishing line, mounted on their horses and with all the flags in the "cask", and have completed the course in accordance with these rules.
25. In the event of all competitors in the final being disqualified for infringement of the rules, the final must be re-run to determine a winner.

26. If on the re-run all the competitors are disqualified for infringement of the rules, the placings will be determined by the times taken in the qualifying round and only if competitors remain equal, a re-run of horses concerned is conducted.
27. If some of the finalists are eliminated in the final or it's re-run (if any) leaving insufficient competitors to fill all the placings, the remaining minor placings will be determined by the times taken in the qualifying round.

SQUARE YARD

1. Course as per diagram.
2. The rider enters through the start/finish line and can take either direction.
3. Rider jumps over each pole and around the right side of each bending pole (making a clover leaf).
4. Then over the pole at start/finish. Timed event
