

EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST Equestrian NSW Vaulting Committee



Background

The Equestrian NSW Vaulting Committee (Vaulting NSW or VNSW)) is a sub-committee of the Equestrian NSW Board and has been in operation since 2002. Before this time it operated as an incorporated body as an ENSW discipline council.

VNSW is charged with the responsibility of administering all aspects of Equestrian Australia Vaulting within NSW, including but not limited to; member/club liaison and event support, consulting on rules and regulations, managing officials programmes, managing the annual Vaulting NSW calendar, liaison with the Australian Vaulting Committee, reporting to the Equestrian NSW Board, assisting with the marketing and promotion of the sport and implementation of training, competition and grass roots strategies aimed at developing the sport.

The finances of the committee are managed by the Equestrian NSW office in consultation with the committee.

Selection Criteria

- Nominees must be current members of Equestrian NSW
- Expressions of interest are called for a committee of seven members appointed on skills-based expertise including but not limited to the areas of; sports knowledge and experience, financial/ professional/management expertise, marketing, administration and education expertise.
- A demonstrated understanding of the vaulting discipline.
- Proven national and international knowledge and experience (competition, training, official) and/or expertise in all areas of vaulting will be an advantage.
- Ability to commit to a minimum of several hours per week to the sport and roles and responsibilities of the committee, which includes meetings, teleconferences and an annual forum.
- Experience of working on a committee, preferably in equestrian sport.

In previous years the committee members have held a term of two continuous years before requests for nominations were received. Equestrian NSW Board will be the selection panel.

To bring the committee into line with other committees in NSW it is proposed that the committee is structured as follows:

For each two year term, three members shall be elected in the first year and four members shall be elected in the second year. No member may serve more than four consecutive terms of two years.

The nominations for each of the terms will be decided by the Committee at their first meeting which will also determine the positions of Chair, Vice Chair.

Progress and needs of the committee will be regularly assessed by the Equestrian NSW Board, including an annual board communication at the Equestrian NSW office, Horsley Park.
