

Rider Notes

Welcome to the 2020 Jenquine Schoolies Champs! We are excited to finally be able to offer an event for our Interschool competitors. These Rider Notes will answer any questions – please read them thoroughly.

Covid Arrival and Departure Protocols

It is very important that we comply with the NSW Government Covid-19 protocols. Our daily numbers are very close to the limit of 500 persons on a venue. All attendees must comply with Covid-19 regulations or will be denied entry to the grounds/requested to leave and no refund issued.

All vehicles <u>must</u> stop at the ticket box inside the main gates to lodge their Covid Self Declaration forms – 1 form per horse with space for both rider's and support person's name. <u>It is strictly one</u> <u>support person allowed per horse</u> – due to the current limit of 500 people please do not bring any extras or they will be denied entry.

A new Covid Self Declaration form must be lodged each day you arrive. When you hand in your Covid form you will be handed a slip that you must place on your dashboard showing the number of people in the vehicle.

When leaving the venue please also stop at the ticket box, indicate how many people are leaving and return your dashboard slip (you will get another one if/when you re-enter)

Arrival and Departure Times

Competition days - Gates will open 6am daily and close at 7pm

Wednesday – Arrivals from 1pm to 7pm.

Campers will need to be inside the venue prior to gate closure each evening.

Stable, camping and cabin list is attached – please check carefully some who were initially able to select in the booking system may have been moved slightly so please take note. Please also carefully check the arrival date of your booking is correct as any payments due will need to be made prior to accessing stables, camp sites or cabins.

Stable manager is Kerry Payne 0402 805 253 – Kerry will need to unlock your stable for you on arrival – Kerry can be found around the stable area.

You will need to bring everything your horse will need — water and feed buckets. Each stable comes with 5 bales of shavings, if you have ordered extras they will be in your stable on arrival, extra bales can also be purchased at the event, payment is by card or online only. To have your stable bond returned you will need to completely clean and sweep out your stable and have it checked and marked off by the stable manager. Please bring your own wheelbarrow, rake, shovel and broom as SIEC do not currently provide these.

Feed supplies – Macarthur Stock Feeds have kindly agreed to make deliveries if required. Orders placed by 11am will be delivered that afternoon. Their number is 02 4655 3567.

Competition Information

Bridle numbers and Draws – Bridle number list is attached. Also attached are the draws for Dressage, Eventing (**draft draw** – please read Eventing Draw Notes) and the Programs for Show Horse. The Jumping Draw will be forwarded early in the week.

You must provide your own number holder. Bridle numbers must be worn by horses at all times when on the grounds and out of their stables (pro tip – for putting number on headcollar wrap some duct tape around the cheek piece and write your bridle number with a permanent texta).

Show horse competitors may use a bridle, saddlecloth or breastplate number as long as their number is clearly displayed.

Eventing riders – your back numbers will be emailed to you on Monday night. You will be required to print them out and bring with you.

Event Office and Merchandise

The Event Office will be a mobile Office and will be located next to our wonderful sponsor Jenquine near each day's competition. Merchandise orders will be available for collection at the mobile office each day.

Dress Code

Interschool uniform is jumper (unless hot), shirt, tie and school saddlecloth for all disciplines (including show horse – numnahs not permitted)

Rules and Regulations

This event is run under EA Discipline Rules and Regulations – it is the competitors responsibility to know and abide by these rules. Swabbing will also take place at this event.

<u>Show Horse specific information</u> - Primary and Secondary rings – program is attached.

Horses are either hunter or open – cannot compete in both. Hunters will not be penalised if wearing a school coloured browband.

Numnahs are not permitted at this event, school saddlecloths must be worn.

<u>Dressage information</u> – as per EA dressage rules gear check is compulsory – you must report to the gear steward and be marked off - penalty is elimination.
